“I’ve seen the smoke of a thousand villages. There no missionary has ever been. There, sir is your field.”

In 1836 young David Livingston’s heart was captured by a few words from veteran missionary Robert Moffat about what he had seen in Africa: “I have sometimes seen, in the morning sun, the smoke of a thousand villages where no one has ever heard the name of Christ.”



That statement stirred in my spirit as Pastor Royce Riggin with Water Hose Ministries, Carl Wood and I jumped in a taxi and headed up the mountain to the Centro de fe y Esperanza: Center for Faith and Hope Church. To be honest, we were tired and we had already had full days and nights of ministry in Medellin. But never the less we wanted to go. After many twists, turns, up and down hills and narrow streets, we finally reached a quaint little church located somewhere high in the mountains. When we arrived, there was just the small worship team of five people. Honestly, my first thought (totally in the flesh) was, “Why did we come all the way out here for just five people?” We were ushered up three flights of steps to meet Pastor Alex and his associate Pastor Omar and they gave us some sort of crème soda to

drink for refreshments. Just then it began to rain and we wondered if the weather might affect the crowd, since most people walked to church. When the pastor said it was time for the service to begin, we trekked back down the stairs and began to praise and worship God and His Spirit filled the place. At that point about 25 people had made their way through the rain to the obscure little church. That is when God began to impress upon me how marvelous this church is because it is a viable witness for Christ! There in one of the highest drug and prostitution areas of Medellin, a city of four million people, it is a light set on a hill shining brightly! I was deeply moved as I thought of the challenges pastors and their families around the world encounter on a daily basis. The charge of Gateway Missions is to Train, Encourage and Equip pastors and church leaders to reach not only their communities; but also to be cross-culturally minded, by planting churches where there is no witness for Christ. **Colombia has six Unreached People Groups who have no knowledge of Christ.** There is a saying, “Where there is smoke there is fire.” That is what we see in Colombia: smoke from churches and ministries ready to burst into flames fanned by the Power of the Holy Spirit!
