Hello dear Pastor Gary and Jane Ann,

We send our love. We are now relatively safe. Nothing extraordinary happens in Transnistria. Only everywhere there are blockades with the military with masks on their faces. We also continue to provide all possible assistance to refugees. We distribute food, clothes, and medicines. Refugees began to realize that the war would last for a long time and now they need to legalize their status in Moldova. A refugee mother

and daughter live in our house with us. When they fled they were let through the border despite the absence of some documents. Now that it has become clear that the de-occupation of their city from the Russian army will not happen soon. Refugees began to look for work, and for this they need to make all the documents, including a residence permit in Moldova. We are assisting them in this matter as well. And these are trips to Chisinau and sitting in lines to all possible bureaucrats. I think that the situation with refugees will get worse by autumn and especially in winter. Most likely Russia will turn off the gas. And Europe has a big shortage of gas, but even if they sell it to Moldova, the price will be too high. I understand that it is time for us to start stocking up on firewood and coal. Otherwise, many families will suffer greatly in winter. This is our story.
