

Waiting is a Process

"Life begins at the end of your comfort zone." These words caught my attention recently as we wait for borders to open so we can begin ministry travel again. While I have never seen Jane Ann and myself as big risk takers, we do believe God has ordained each of us for specific purposes and seasons. Over the years we can see a pattern of how God, through the Holy Spirit, has guided our lives. At times it is powerful and exciting, and others times it has been still and peaceful. Then there are some periods when God seems quiet and distant. I am almost certain each of us has known these seasons. It is interesting to me how in the times when God is moving powerfully, we experience exhilaration to be strong, confident and decisive. (Romans 8:37 "Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us.") In the still and peaceful times there resides a deep sense of awe and wonder for the Lord. (Psalm 46:10 "Be still and know that I am God.") But it is in the quiet and distant times that we have a tendency to be undone and feel forsaken. (Psalm 141:1 "O LORD, I cry out to you, Come quickly. Open your ears to me when I cry out to you.") In these lonely periods we are the most vulnerable and open to the attacks of the adversary in our thoughts as he reminds us of our shortcomings and failures. Our emotions can be our own worst enemy. Remember, WAITING IS A PROCESS and His silence is NOT forever. Simply put, God answers prayers in three ways: First, in the powerful and thrilling times when it seems His answers are always YES! Second, in the tranquil and peaceful times there is His awesome assurance in the NOT YET/LATER. But in the seasons of NO/NOT NOW, our spiritual compasses spin as though we are in a magnetic field of uncertainty. These are the times we must anchor our souls to the WORD of God to endure and persevere. (Psalm 119:105 "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.") The Bible is life and it feeds our spirits and our souls with instruction on what is truth and morally correct. It is our roadmap in uncertain times because it is the very voice of God spoken through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Whatever season we find ourselves in, God's plan for us has not changed. We must REST in the WAITING to ENJOY every season. I love this statement: **SOMETIMES I WIN AND OTHER TIMES I LEARN.**

Our dear friends you are precious to us and it is our prayer that you walk in peace, strength and wisdom as God prospers, comforts and restores your souls. Be confident in the certainty of (Romans 8:38-39 "Nothing shall separate us from the love of God." and Hebrews 6:19 "This hope is a strong and trustworthy anchor for our souls. It leads us through the curtain into God's inner sanctuary.")
