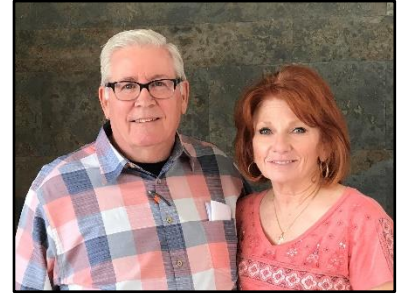

Cuba is a place caught in the past. There has been no real economic growth or new development of housing. Old buildings, old streets and old cars are evidence of a society without hope. The people are friendly enough, but lack opportunity and desire to change. Communication has improved some with the arrival of modern technology. The digital age is creeping in with a profound presence. Many people, especially the young, now have cell phones and are able to connect with friends and family beyond their cities and villages. There are few modern conveniences, such as air-conditioning and necessities like toilet paper and tooth paste can sometimes be very difficult to find. Our Cuban friends told us, "If you are lucky enough to find needed items and blessed enough to afford them, you should get them immediately, for they will not be available the next day."

The church is a place of connection and community where people thrive and find purpose in worshipping God. Christ is their anchor in the midst of their storms. For Cubans, comfort is not a prerequisite for a healthy Christian life. The reality of the presence of God is their strength and sustenance.

Pastor Michael and his family live in Sanguily, one of the poorest villages in the district. They are home church pastors, peanut farmers and oversee two missions which are 7.5 miles away. Their mode of transportation is to walk or go by bicycle. They have passion and drive to see God transform their region. The three year drought in Cuba decimated much of their crop. Their church needed a new roof, so Joshua Nations and Gateway Missions (thanks to your support) provided funds to replace the six foot roof.

Pastors Conference in Ciego de Avila



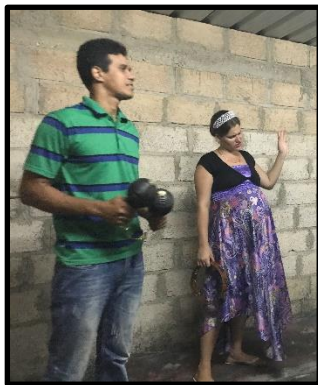
